

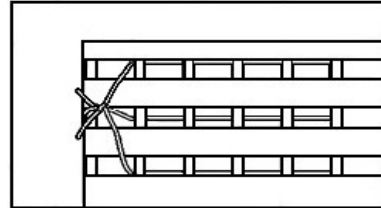
Hanging Curtains

Observation:

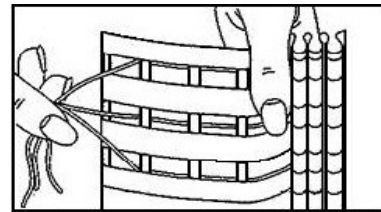
Curtains are made from heavy fabrics and come with supplementary lining, therefore make sure that the track or pole to be used is securely fixed to the wall, so it can support their weight. You should take special notice to tracks and poles which are fixed to plaster board walls.

Hanging Pencil Pleat Curtains

1. The draw cords of the tape must be fastened at both sides of the curtain. Make the knot where two curtains meet, at the leading knot.

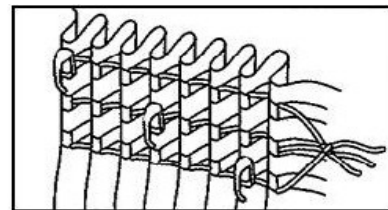


2. Gather the curtain to reach the desired width and create even pleats by drawing the cords at the opposite side at the same time.

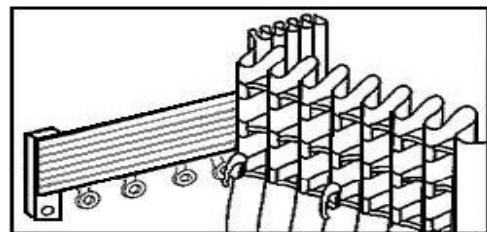


3. Tighten the cords without cutting the excess strings so that the curtains can be loosened when they need to be cleaned. The excess cords can be tucked behind the heading tape in order to maintain a pleasant appearance.

4. There are three rows of hook pockets in the heading tape. The top row should be used to reveal the track or pole, and the bottom row to reveal the track. The middle row is for hooks or a glider rail.



5. Place a hook at both ends of the tape, then position the remaining ones at a distance of approximately 10 cm along the tape.



Hanging Eyelet Curtains

Run each eyelet over the pole and secure the curtain by positioning the outer eyelets between the finial of the pole and the bracket.

Observation: In order to open or close single panel curtains, they must be secured on only one side of the pole.

After you hang the curtains, they must be kept drawn with the eyelets close to each other and the folded section must be at the back to make sure that the curtains hang regularly.
